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Additional notes for KS4 assessment:

Key Dates:

- Students will make choices for full or short course selections after the first round of mocks at the end of September, to be formalised after half term.
- In class assessments for year 11s, covering all year 10 work, will take place at the end of September.
- First round of directed interventions in KS4 will take place after the October half term.
- Mock examinations in December will cover all year 10 work and half of the year 11 coverage.
- Second round of February mocks will cover similar content as the December mocks but will have been subject to deep feedbacks.
- Final departmental assessments to be taken before Easter holidays to inform revision sessions after half term.
